

***Official Rules and Regulations**

HOW TO ENTER

1. To be eligible to win a prize in this Contest, enter on-line at tenniseveryday.com or championschaquejour.com and follow the entry instructions. Complete the on-line entry fields. **NO PURCHASE NECESSARY.** Limit one (1) entry per person. Any personal information submitted will only be used for the purposes of administering this contest. PRIZE DRAW, PRIZE DESCRIPTION & ODDS
